DESCRIPTION OF INDICATOR	<p><i>Definition:</i> The prevalence of temporary employment is measured as the share of temporarily employed persons (usually employed with a fixed-term contract) in comparison with the total number of employed persons in a given age group.</p> <p>The figure is derived from the Labour Force Survey.</p> <p><i>The number of people in temporary employment</i> is determined by quarterly labour force surveys.
